#### **Mission Statement**

Ethel Winterheimer-Staton Elementary School, in partnership with the community, is dedicated to creating a challenging and enriched academic environment that promotes accountability and empowers learning for life.

### **Principal's Highlights**

Staton Elementary School is a 5 Star School for the third year in a row. We are so proud of our students and thank our parents, teachers, and community for their support.

- Accelerated classes were offered to over 125 students in first through fifth grade.
- Weekly science classes were provided for students in first through fifth grade.
- Before and after-school tutoring programs were offered to students for assistance with reading and math.
- A weekly "Explorations" program was in place to promote positive behavior, attendance, and enhance academics for all students.
- The Measuring Academic Progress (MAP) assessment tool was utilized to measure the annual growth of all students (K-5) in reading and math.
- The "Be Kind" program was implemented schoolwide to promote a positive classroom and school culture.
- The Criterion Referenced Test data showed 90% of our third, fourth, and fifth grade students were proficient in math.
- The Criterion Referenced Test data showed that 85% of our third, fourth, and fifth grade students were proficient in English Language Arts (ELA).
- Students at Staton ES are scoring over 18% above the district and state in math and reading proficiency.

## **Goals and Objectives**

#### Goal 1

Increase the percentage of students proficient in reading.

#### Objective(s):

Increase the percent of all students meeting Adequate Growth Percentile in reading from 77.0 to 81.0 as measured by Nevada School Performance Framework.

#### Goal 2

Increase the percentage of students proficient in math.

#### Objective(s):

Increase the percent of all students meeting Adequate Growth Percentile in math from 67.3 to 80.0 as measured by Nevada School Performance Framework.

### **School Communication Efforts**

Staton Elementary provides ample opportunities for two-way and meaningful communication. Parents receive newsletters highlighting important information and events. Our website is consistently updated to inform parents of schedules, information, school and Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) events. Parents can access the school website to contact administration and teachers. All teachers respond to parent questions or concerns through e-mail, phone calls, notes, or daily communication on the playground. Parents may also receive information through e-mails and phone calls from the ParentLink system. The administration has an open-door policy to meet with parents face-to-face regarding any issues that need to be addressed. Staff and administration attend regularly scheduled P.T.O. meetings to collaboratively plan events and assist in schoolwide initiatives. Parent volunteers and community members attend an orientation workshop and are welcomed at Staton Elementary. We believe parents are our partners in helping their children achieve academic success.
